SA POLICE THANKED FOR DONATING \$400,000 TO BRAIN TUMOUR RESEARCH SINCE 2010

The NRF has been privileged to be involved in Ride Like Crazy since 2010. Over the past 5 years, Ride Like Crazy has attracted over 9,500 riders and donated \$800,000 to fight cancer. The NRF is the receipient of \$400,000 of these funds for brain tumour research. The NRF thanked SA Police at Government House for these generous donations towards brain tumour research.

BRAIN TUMOUR RESEARCH FUNDED BY RIDE LIKE CRAZY 2014

The 2014 Ride Like Crazy money will continue to fund the research of PhD research students, specifically Kimberley Mander and Stefan Court-Kowalski who commenced their studies in 2014. Their research is focussed on looking at stopping cancer cells derived from peripheral cancers (breast, prostate, melanoma) from entering the brain and markedly reducing both quality of life and life expectancy, as well as halting the rapid growth of these tumour cells once they have entered the brain.


